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Walk and Draw Event

Consists of two shooters: one on the left and one on the right. At the signal, each shooter engages two knockdown targets then engages the flag tree. The object is to get all the flags over to your opponent's side before your opponent gets them all on your side. Whoever gets all the flags to the to the opponent's side wins that stage and advances to the next bracket to take on the next challenger till there are none...

Precision/Tactical Shooting Event

Silhouette Stage

Distance = 50 foot

Targets = Bianchi D-1 CDB cardboard

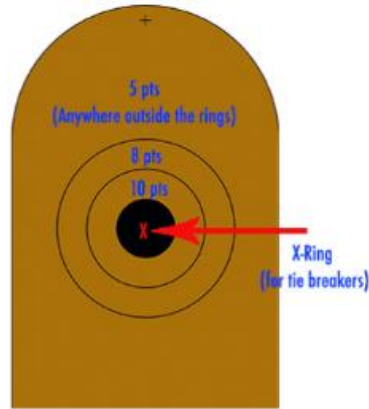
Score = 300 points total

Course of Fire

Slow Fire: 10 shots in 5 minutes
(100 points)

Timed Fire: 5 shots in 12 seconds
(2 relays—10 shots total) (100 points)

Rapid Fire: 5 shots in 8 seconds
(2 relays—10 shots total) (100 points)



Tactical Steel Stage

Distance = Various (15-50 feet)

Targets = Knock down steel plates

Score = 300 points total

Course of Fire (Course 1)

Timed Fire: 15 plates in 25 seconds (150 points)

Shooter will start in first box. At the signal, shooter will engage 5 plates, advance to second box with mandatory magazine change, engage 5 plates in second box, advance to third box with mandatory magazine change, and engage the last 5 plates in third box (one shot per target—15 shots total).

Course of Fire (Course 2)

Timed Fire: 15 Plates in 60 seconds (150 points)

Shooter will start in box. At the signal, shooter will engage plates as they see them (one shot per target—15 shots total).

Directions to Corona Sportsmen's Club

DO NOT FOLLOW GOOGLE MAPS!

From 91 East: Exit La Sierra (go south) approximately 6 miles to Cajalco Road, turn left.

Cajalco Road (approximately 3 miles) to Lake Mathews Drive, turn right. Follow the blue ribbon stakes.

Lake Mathews Drive (approximately 3 miles) and turn right at stone pillars to gate opening. Follow the blue ribbon stakes.

At 2nd dirt road, turn right. Follow the blue ribbon stakes.

You will now be on a bumpy dirt road. There might be water in the ravine. It's okay to drive through it. Follow the blue ribbon

Firearms/Equipment/Ammunition

Firearms: Any type of legal 22 or larger caliber permitted either revolver or semi-auto. 6 shot minimum capability, magazines to be loaded with no more than 10 rounds (no laser sights).

Magazines: 3 magazines or 4-5 speed loaders

Ammunition: 150 round minimum recommended. No magnums (.357, .44 Mag., etc.), except 22 WMR allowed.

Safety: Eye and ear protection mandatory (range has eye and ear protection if you don't have any).

Holster & Mag Pouches: Any holster that will safely hold the firearm, as well as magazine or speed loader holders (pockets work, too). Dump pouches available for purchase at the shoot (\$10) if desired but not mandatory (can be used as magazine/speed loader holders).

Alibi: Shooters may experience firearm or ammunition issues during a shoot. Should this occur, the shooter will raise their hand to notify the Range Officer. If the issue once evaluated by the RO is approved, there will be an alibi and the shooter will be allowed to continue or re-run that stage. Only one alibi per stage will be allowed.
